- A. CTE Electrical Instructor for 2023-24 Chris Chamberlin. Contract for the 2023-24 academic year. Compensation will be \$40.70 per hour and is not to exceed \$45,000.00; funding for this position comes from the CTE Millage revenue.
- B. CTE Electrical Instructor Mentor for 2023-24 Theresa Krejci. Contract for the 2023-24 academic year. Compensation will be \$40.00 per hour and is not to exceed \$16,800.00; funding for this position comes from the CTE Millage revenue.
- C. WIOA Case Manager Misti Leitelt. Contract for the period June 12, 2023 through August 12, 2023 at a rate of \$30.00 per hour for up to 24 hours per week, not to exceed \$6,300.00; funding for this position comes from the 203-24 Michigan Works grant.

D. 3P (Place, Problem, Project)/PBL-STEM Instructional Coach – Chelsee Schram. Contract for the 2023-24 academic year. The position will serve the five (5) county region) Shiawassee, Clinton, Eaton, Ingham, and Ionia). The contract will be paid at a rate of \$40.00 per hour note to exceed \$2,000.00 per month or \$24,000.00 in total for the contract period.

This position provides facilitation of awareness in programs and opportunities to encourage engagement and participation in the 3P learning systems throughout MiSTEM Region 7.

This position will be funded with regional grant funds provided by the MiSTEM Grant.

E. Illuminate/SAEBRS Fast Bridge Contract (Software License/Support and SAEBRS universal screening tool) – Renaissance

Shiawassee RESD will continue the Illuminate/SAEBRS Fast Bridge contract with Renaissance for the period of three (3) academic years: 2023-24, 2024-25, 2025-26. The contract will end June 20, 2026. Estimated cost of \$70,000.00-\$75,000.00 per year.

This warehouse serves all eight local districts and the Shiawassee RESD and is used for many purposes including report creation, data analysis, assessment and program evaluation. Local districts reimbursing the ISD at a per pupil rate. SAEBRS is a K-12 universal screening tool that provides an overall score (Total Behavior) and three subscales (Social Behavior, Academic Behavior, and Emotional Behavior). It is connected to Illuminate sot he data collected is quickly available to educators and can be added to reports within the Illuminate warehouse. The tool is referenced in the MI Blueprint for Comprehensive Student Recovery document from the Governor's office. SAEBRS costs \$3.12 per student with MySAEBRS included free of charge. Local districts will pay based on student participation with grant and general funds being used to offset the cost. The final contract amount will depend on local district participation.

F. Greater Michigan Construction Academy (GMCA) – Electrical CTE Certification (curriculum) for 2023-24.

GMCA will provide training, safety and credentialing to the Shiawassee RESD staff and students for the CTE Electrical program through the National Center for Construction Education and Research (NCCER). The cost for this agreement is \$100.00 per student per semester (there has been no increase in the per student fee from the 2022-23 academic year to the 2023-24 academic year) and will be funded by CTE Millage revenue.

Under Perkins V, all CTE programs in Michigan must provide students the opportunity to earn State recognized credentials that are valued by industry and business. The NCCER is nationally recognized for residential and commercial electrical licensing. This agreement allows CTE students to begin earning their NCCER credentials while still in high school.

This position will be funded in full by the Perkins grant.

First and second year students in CTE Electrical, Health Science Academy, and Teaching Cadet programs submitted suggestions.

Submissions were reviewed by Shiawassee RESD Associate Superintendent/CTE Director, Charmian Fletcher, and Shiawassee RESD CTE Dean of Students, Paul Brieger. "Shiawassee RESD College and Career Readiness Center" reflects the naming theme of the students' suggestions and the type of learning the building will support.

Additionally, it was suggested that Nellie Reed be honored in some fashion, such as a dedication of the playground or the naming of a student award in her name.
