Decisions for funding will be based upon: budgetary allowances each year, how well the scholar has completed the application and expressed their desire to attend the program, how well the program aligns with the scholar's Educational Development Plan and future goals, how well the program aligns with the stated scholarship requirements, rubric scores, financial need-must be stated on the application.

The Cook Family Foundation and the Shiawassee Regional Education Service District are pleased to offer the Shiawassee Scholars Program that encourages and recognizes academic excellence. The Shiawassee Scholars Program requires a student be enrolled full-time at a public high school in Shiawassee County. As a Shiawassee Scholar you may request a scholarship that offers academically talented students an opportunity to further explore a career path or advanced study in a particular discipline. There is a limited amount of scholarship funds available. Candidates will be selected by the Shiawassee Scholars Advisory Committee based on a rubric scoring system which can be found at www.sresd.org. There is a possible 18 points on the rubric; applicants must receive a 12 or higher to be considered for a scholarship and those with the highest rubric scores will be considered first for scholarships. Scores will not determine the dollar amount of the scholarship you receive; the amount is a decision of the Shiawassee Scholars Committee and is based on the number of requests and budgetary allowances each year.

The goal of the scholarship is to allow Scholars an opportunity to pursue a program that is not available through their regular high school classes. The program should be academic in nature and should align with the student's career pathway. It is preferred that the program also be culturally diverse and meet the criteria of accepting only students who excel in academics. The goal of this experience is for the Scholar to interact and learn with students of similar academic ability as they engage in accelerated and unique learning experiences. The Shiawassee Scholars Advisory Committee approves funds for program tuition costs; checks are issued directly to the program, not as reimbursement. Students may apply for funding of up to 75% of the tuition cost of the program with the maximum being \$2,000. The percentage is based on what the student/parent is paying. Other scholarships or contributions cannot be included in this amount.

Examples of programs meeting the criteria would include, but are not limited to, Math Science Technology (MST) at MSU, National Youth Leadership Programs, or the Center for Talent Development at Northwestern University. You will find links on the Shiawassee Scholars web page to various colleges so you may research their program offerings. ***Go to www.sresd.org, click on Programs and Services, click on Shiawassee Scholars and then Programs and Camps.*** Students may also apply for a scholarship if they are accepted to Michigan State University's, year-round, classes of Cooperative Highly Accelerated Math Program (CHAMP), Intensive Study in the Humanities, Arts, Language and Literature (ISHALL) or the Accelerated French Language Program (LEAF). Students may apply to other universities accelerated, year-round classes, each are evaluated individually.

Additional scholarship details:

- The first step is to apply for the camp and make them aware there is a possibility of receiving a scholarship from Shiawassee Scholars. Applications may be accepted during the school year for programs that run September-April. Submit your scholarship application as soon as you make the commitment to attend a camp.
- Shiawassee Scholars whose families may have extenuating circumstances and are willing to provide evidence of financial need may qualify to receive up to 100% of the cost of the program. This information must be provided with the application.
- The scholarships are competitive in nature and will be awarded based upon the type of program the student intends to attend, the number of students applying for scholarships, budgetary allowances, and rubric scores. Scholars are allowed one scholarship. A copy of the rubric is attached.
- Scholarships should be used prior to your junior year in high school (some exceptions may apply but require prior approval). Applications for funding of summer programs must be **postmarked by February 28**. Scholarships do not pay for school-sponsored experiences, transportation costs, recreation/sports camps or religious affiliation camps.
