WIOA participants knocked it out of the park during Spring Training at the Shiawassee RESD in March. Julianne Ackerson from LAFCU provided students with valuable information on financial literacy, covering the basics of banking, loans, and interest, how to keep their financial information safe, and how to recognize financial scams. Students also learned how to hit a home run with a successful job interview by practicing answering common interview questions and identifying good questions to ask an employer. A selfie station helped students identify and highlight the strengths they bring to a job.
